## Naming of the First New Elementary School

The former Southwest Elementary School; first new elementary school to be built as a part of the 2007 Capital Improvement Program was recently named for a former educator who made quite an impact on this school district. The school will be named in honor of the late Hazel Harvey Peace, whose career spanned forty-nine years in Fort Worth ISD. Mrs. Peace served as a teacher, debate team coach, counselor and vice principal of the historic I. M. Terrell High School. Mrs. Peace served not only as an educator but as a community activist, humanitarian and philanthropist. Hazel Harvey Peace Elementary School will be located at the intersection of Sycamore School Road and Trail Lake Drive in the southwest area of Fort Worth.

On May 27th at 10:00 AM, the Groundbreaking Ceremony will take place at the school site. Many former students of Mrs. Peace as well as local officials are expected to attend and participate in this event.

## Technology Upgrades for Fort Worth ISD

As a part of the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) technology upgrades, Promethean Interactive White Boards (IWB) will be installed in classrooms across Fort Worth ISD. The installation began in August 2008 at Northside High School. As of April 2009, 2,650 IWB have been installed in classrooms. Additional technology funds have been used to upgrade 7,845 computers at various campuses. More than 2,800 classroom teachers have received foundations training. The CIP Office will continue to update the community on the status of the technology upgrades.
