

Discipline: Students are expected to act appropriately.

1st minor offense: Phone call home/documentation letter sent home.

2nd minor offense: Parent conference with teacher(s) and administrator. Parent will be notified that on the third offense, student will be removed from the Optional Extended Year Program.

3rd minor offense: Student will be removed from the Optional Extended Year Program.

Serious offense: Student will be removed from the program immediately. Examples: vandalism, theft, tobacco, alcohol, drugs, weapons, hazardous items, assault (physical or verbal), extortion, or abusive language.

Selection Criteria:

- Students identified for retention in the same grade.
EIE (Local) - In grades 6-8, promotion to the next grade level shall be based on an overall average of 70 on a scale of 100 based on course-level, grade-level standards (essential knowledge and skills) for all subject areas and a grade of 70 or above in three of the following areas: language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.
- Any 8th grade student that has failed the second administration of TAKS Math and or TAKS Reading, will be required to attend the Student Success Initiative Summer Program.
- Any student who has failed one core course is eligible for summer school. It is highly recommended the student take reading as a second class to strength vocabulary and comprehension skills.

*If a student takes 2 classes, transportation will be provided. Transportation is provided for delivery to school at 8 am and pick up at 12:25 pm from school. For any student not taking 2 classes, transportation will be the responsibility of the parent.

All students will be provided sixteen days of specifically designed instruction for the successful promotion to their next grade level.

Registration Dates: All students will be selected and registered at their home schools prior to Wednesday, May 6, 2009.

Dates of Program: June 11 – July 2, 2009

Dress Code: Students will adhere to the dress code established at each summer school site. Contact your home school for dress code information.

Transportation: Transportation will be provided at feeder elementary school sites for students in grades 6, 7, and 8 who live greater than two miles from their home school, or if the area is a hazardous area relative to the student walking to school.
Contact your home school for information about transportation.

Attendance: Ninety percent attendance is required for completion of the sixteen day program. Only **two** days of absences will be permitted before a student is removed from the program. (***A third absence for any reason will warrant removal.***) The only acceptable reasons for an absence are personal illness (with a doctor's excuse) and/or serious illness or death in the immediate family. Students will be removed on the third absence. If your child is absent, contact the school clerk by phone. When your child returns to school, they must bring a signed note from the parent giving name, date, teacher, days absent, reason for absence, a doctor's excuse if applicable and telephone number where a parent can be reached.

Progress Reports: Weekly progress reports will be mailed to notify parents of the students' achievement.

Tardies: Any time missed in the classroom is serious. Students arriving late interrupt the learning process. **Tardies are unacceptable.**

General Rules & Policies: All FWISD policies and rules are to be followed. All students received a Student Handbook and Code of Conduct Book for the 2008-2009 school year and are expected to know and follow these procedures. Please refer to these documents for any questions. These policies cover everything from truancy and pupil conduct to bus rider rules and regulations. **Unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated.** Any behavior that disrupts a safe and orderly learning environment will result in removal from the program and its opportunities.

Supplies: Students need to bring the following supplies with them to the Optional Extended Year Program beginning the first day: Three-ring binder or folder, notebook paper, two No. 2 pencils, two blue/black ball point ink pens.
