(Topics in the video include: prohibition, speakeasies, flappers, women, bootlegging. Then I show the video snippet from the 1920's from United Streaming.0 When we are finished I have them draw a colorful picture of what they see themselves doing during the 1920's on the back of their photo analysis sheet.**
