NetSmartz® is an interactive, educational program of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children® that provides age appropriate resources to teach children how to be safer online. NetSmartz® also provides training to educate parents, guardians and communities on how to help keep children and teens safe online. This 30 minute to one hour presentation for parents and guardians of children ages 5 to 17 years old focuses on how to facilitate conversations with children and teens about the Internet.
